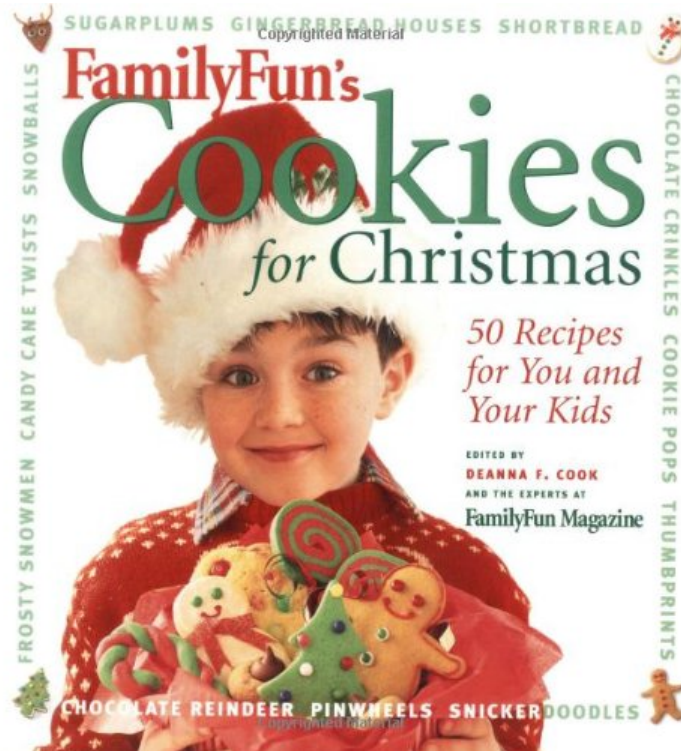

As soon as we saw the "Holiday Garland" on page 22, that was what she wanted to do. Each year has been successful, but it has been a struggle to find the right recipes, decorations we loved and/or could duplicate, etc. We stumbled across this book and have found FAME. The recipes are quick, clear, error-proof, and delicious. The instructions break down the adult part and the child's part. He reads, he sifts he measures. He pats he rolls. The Candy Glass is beautiful and wins raves (a slightly treacherous affair, but well worth it). One suggestion - ALWAYS SIFT THE FLOUR. One batch was troublesome because I didn't sift the flour.
