The last recipe ends

on pg 372. And Glossary ends on pg 388, so you can tell that there are plenty of savory and sweet pie recipes, to include a chapter dedicated to just pie crusts. Many of the recipes of this generation included shortening. This book is no exception. So, adapt to your preference. Just thumbing through the book, I see a Pork and Apple pie that I think I'll make first. There is a Pineapple-upside-down pie (new to me) and several Pear pies that bring back childhood memories. I notice a Grated Sweet Potato Pie and several versions of a Green Tomato Pie.
