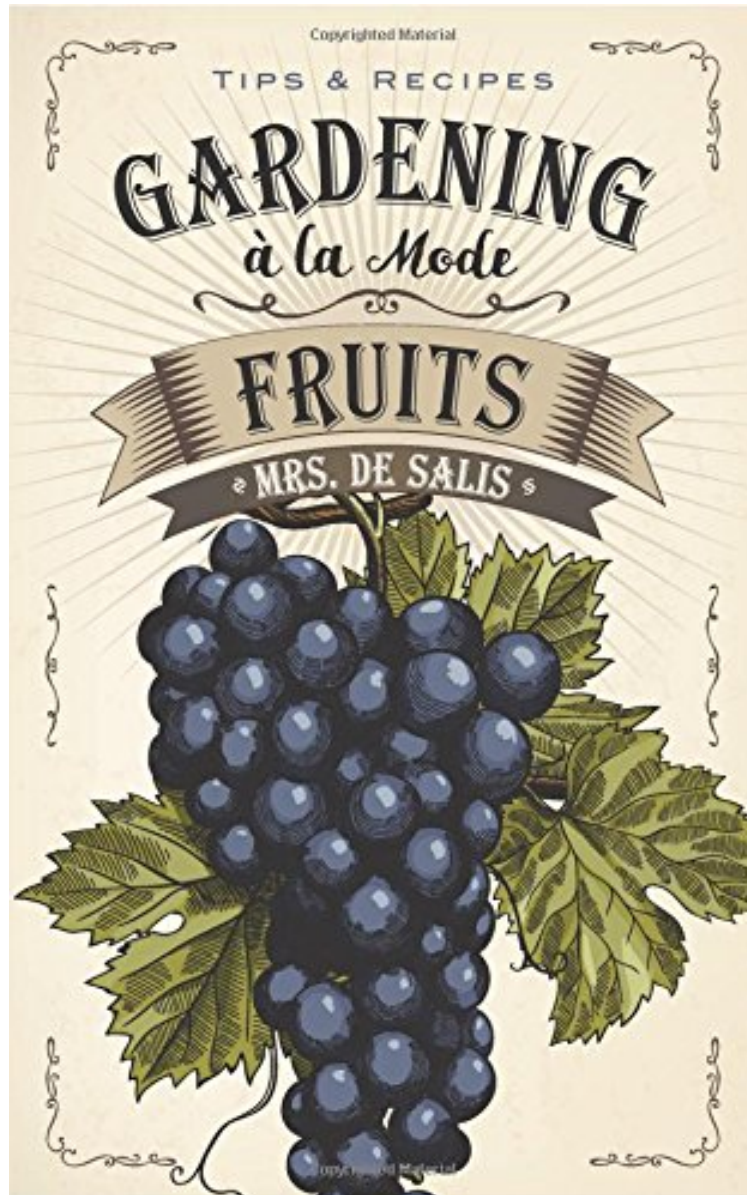

I would not recommend some of them, but others are still relevant. There are recipes for some lovely and simple ways of using the fruit. It is a lovely walk down memory lane.
