I know all this because I worked there as a bread baker. Some of the absolutely best stuff on Earth came out of those ovens, and this recipe book by Bru herself captures them in all their glory and ingredient purity. I won't go into details of the goods or recipes since if you've navigated to this page you probably know all about Bru's Buns Breads. If so, buy this book. It's got all the recipes you remember, and they're just as good now 30 years later. It also includes all the postcard artwork that used to accompany the package labels, poems by the infamous baker Doug (e.g., "As the Sheep Attack the Bakery Screaming Nonsense"), tips on both life and baking from Bru "Weather and mood affect baking. Low cloud ceilings slow down the rising process. Angry people's cakes fall. Bread dough loves to be pummeled. Baking is an excellent form of therapy." and "May the buns always rise".
