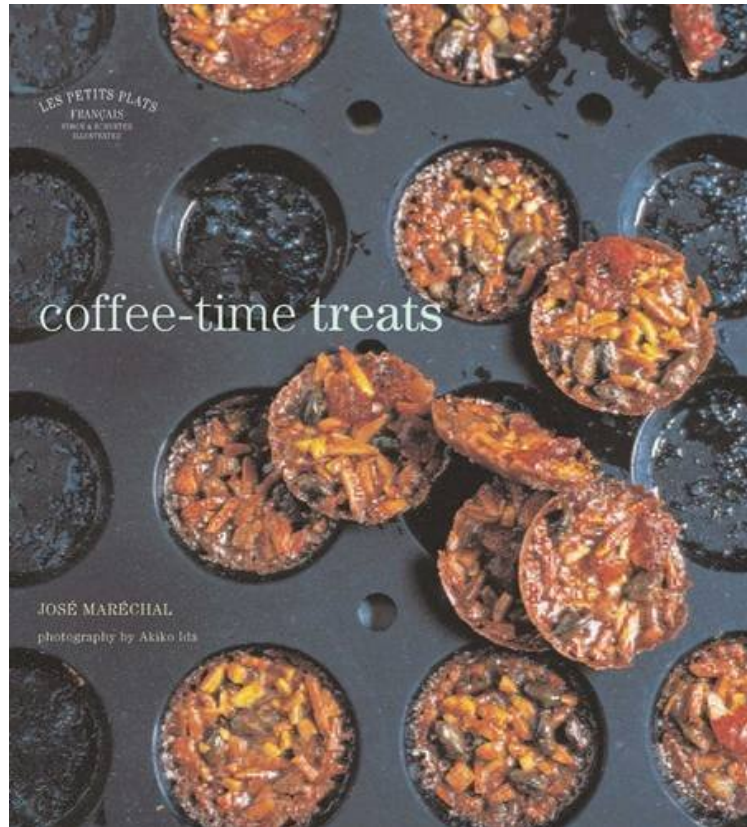

There are some recipes for coffee and 1 for hot chocolate. The rest of the recipes range from candy type to dessert, brownies, biscuits and petit fours. Measurements are in imperial and metric and there is also a conversion chart and an index.The treats are all lovely, each with a nice picture and are not that hard to make, if you have a bit of cooking experience. Some are ordinary recipes such as mini brownies, others for truffles and langues de chat.My one caution would be to realize that this book only has 35 recipes - so compare that to the cost and see if it is worth the price to you, although it does make a nice little gift.1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. However, be aware that the recipes are written using grams or ounces for measurement, and the baking temps are in Celcius. There is a conversion chart in the back of the book so you can convert the recipes if you need to.
