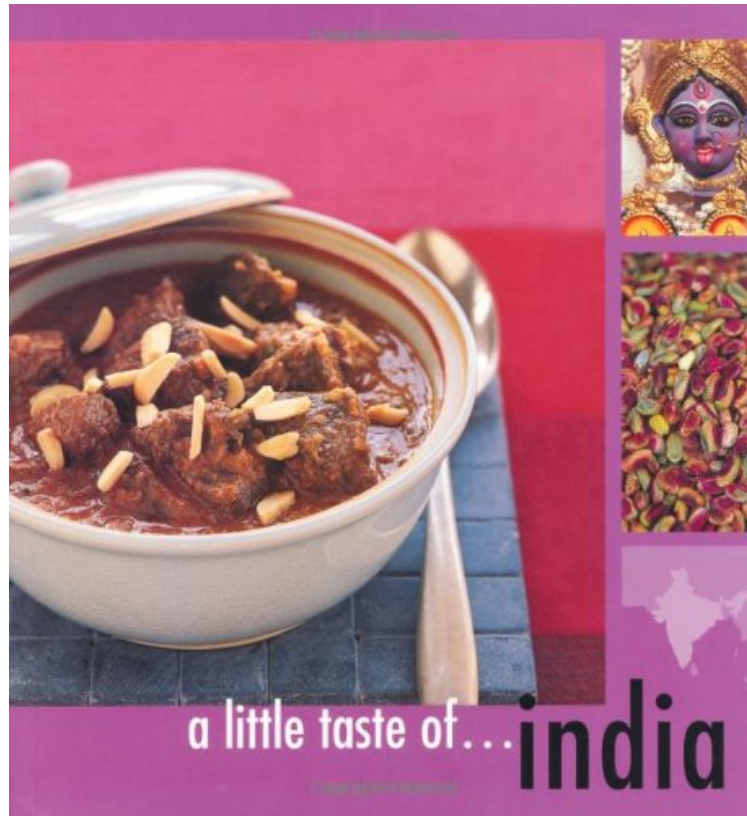

Typically when i buy a cookbook, i end up making only one or two recipes out of it, which doesn't make for a very good investment. But with this book, the first Indian cookbook i ever owned, i've probably made about fifteen different dishes, some of which have become part of my regular repertoire. Recipes i particularly like (which may be named somewhat differently, since what i own is actually the Dutch translation of this book) are: Punjabi-style cabbage, saag gosht (spinach with lamb), spicy eggplant (which i have simplified by not frying the eggplant first), cardemom chicken (great for guests!), and chole chaat (a chickpea stew).
