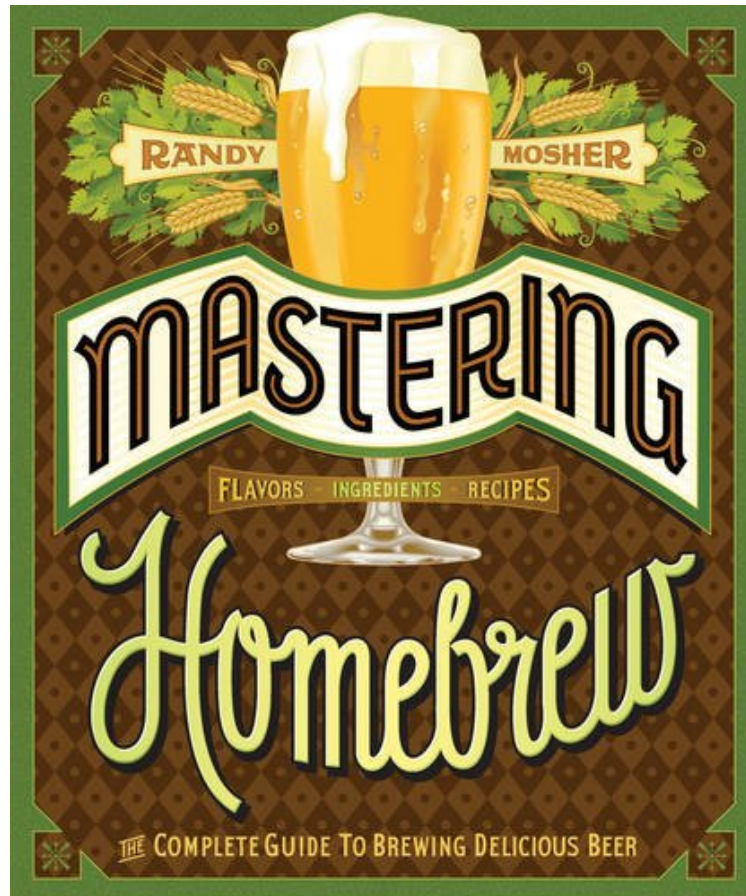

This book would make an excellent replacement or substitute for Papazian's Joy of Homebrewing. Mastering Homebrew covers all the topics you need to get started, from ingredients and equipment to recipes and troubleshooting. There's even a very brief introductory section for first-time brewers who are chomping at the bit to put down the book and start brewing. Mosher teaches the best way possible, with minimal hand-holding and encourages readers to get out there and experiment, tweak, and find their own voice through their technique, equipment, and recipes. trade, Mosher fills the book with beautiful charts that are as informative as they are eye-catching. However, the "Mastering" part is light. I've read dozens of brewing books and found this to be mid to low on the expertise spectrum. If you are looking for a good advanced brewing book, I'd recommend Strong's Brewing Better Beer and the Water/Hops/Yeast series (haven't tackled Malt yet).
