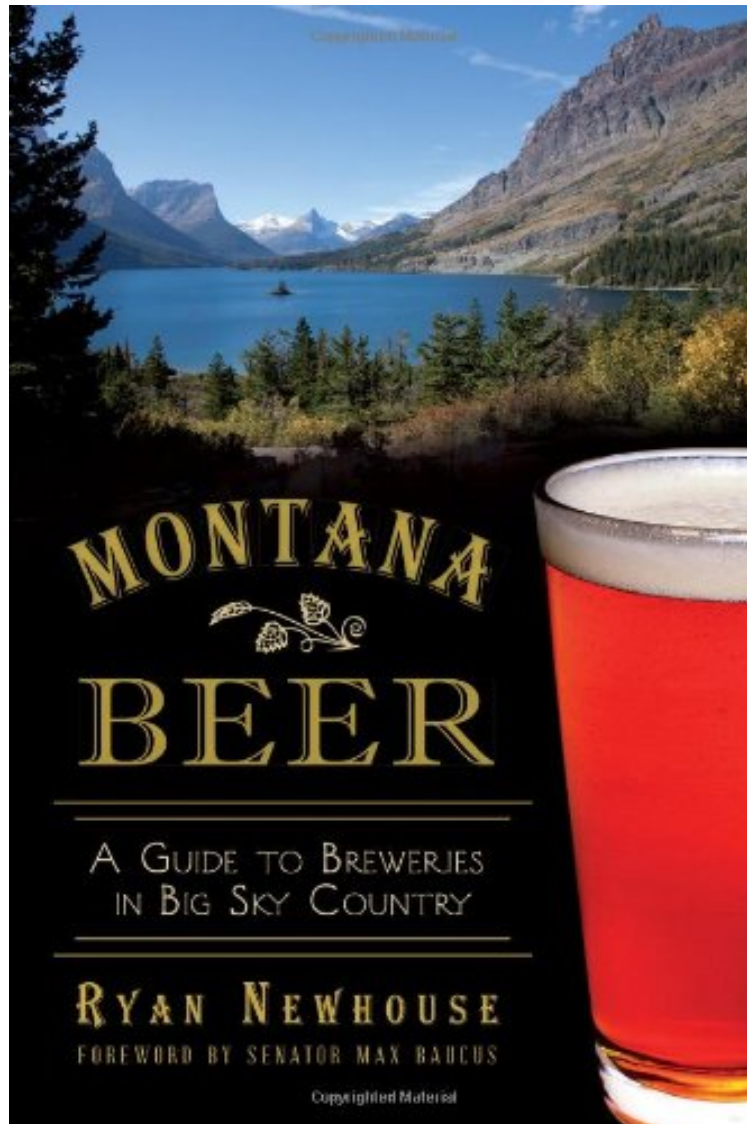

As a reader and writer of Montana history I was surprised to learn some things that I hadn't know. What I found particularly fascinating was just how many breweries operated in the state, and how much beer they produced! Montana Beer does a great job following the entire history of brewing in the state, from its humble beginnings catering to the gold camps of Virginia City and Helena, onward through the state's heyday in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Newhouse does a great job detailing how the state's major breweries hit hard times in the 1950s and 60s. From that point on Montana didn't see another brewery until the local microbrew market began to open up in the state during the late 1980s. Each of those pioneering breweries are then talked about in full, and it's quite the entertaining account. I'd recommend this book to anyone interested in regional beer, Montana history, the brewing industry in general, or where to get a good beer in Montana!

Montana's brewing history stretches back more than 150 years to the state's days as a territory. But the art of brewing in Montana has come a long way since the frontier era. Today, nearly forty craft breweries span the Treasure State, and the quality of their output rivals the best craft beer produced anywhere in the country. Maybe it's because there's also a little piece of Montana in every glass, as the state's brewers pride themselves on using cold mountain water and locally sourced barley harvested from Montana's ample fields. From grain to glass, "Montana Beer: A Guide to Breweries in Big Sky Country" tells the story of the brewers and breweries that make the Treasure State's brew so special.
