It's a great book, full of imaginative recipes for delicious cookies. The reason I'm not giving it 5 stars is that the recipes as-is are usually too sweet for my taste so I halve the amount of sugar. But I find most American desserts too sweet, so the fault may be mine rather than the book's.The "Cookiecraft" section up front gives good information about equipment, ingredients and techniques, making this is a very suitable book for a young or inexperienced cook. For example, it explains the difference between different hand-mixing operations: cream, beat, stir, whisk, mix, fold, cut in. And the text is written large, which may be helpful for older cooks.Finally, although monster-size cookies are featured, there are instructions for scaling them down to regular sizes.
